## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Competition for premiums is open to residents and non-residents of Cass County. Except in 4-H Club Department, only 4-H'ers entered for Cass County may exhibit in 4-H.

**2. NO EXHIBIT MAY BE REMOVED PRIOR TO 4PM, SUNDAY, JUNE 29, OR ALL PREMIUMS AND AWARDS WILL BE FORFEITED.**

3. Exhibitors will be required to keep their exhibits open for view from 11am to 9 pm. All exhibits will be released at Noon the last day of the fair. **All exhibits or concessions must keep the grounds around their exhibit or concession free from garbage, litter and refuse, for a distance of at least 10 feet fronting their exhibit or concession.**

**4. Cass County Agricultural Association (CCAA) will not assume any responsibility for disease, sickness, injury, loss or damage to exhibits contracted during the fair.**

5. No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter on the grounds, except from their place of business or exhibit. The tacking or posting of any advertisements, or distribution of bills, cards, flyers, etc., except within the space occupied by the exhibitor is prohibited. Anyone violating this rule will be liable to fine and expulsion from the grounds as the Board of Directors may elect.

6. The management will not be responsible for typographical errors in this book, but should any occur, same will be interpreted by the Board of Directors.

7. The Board of Directors reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of or incident to the fair.

8. Any persons knowingly violating any of the rules of this Society will thereby forfeit all rights to any premiums that may be awarded to them and possible forfeiture of future exhibits.

9. Make sure that at release of exhibits that all items belong to rightful owner(s). Abuse of ownership will be prosecuted by CCAA to the full extent of the law and refusal of future exhibition for violator(s) at Cass County Fair.

10. Collection must be neatly arranged and fully labeled. A duplication of varieties in any collection shall bar the collection from prize money. Standard varieties will be given the preference.

11. All awards shall be made by comparison of the individual merits of the entries. Premiums will not be awarded on articles or animals of inferior merit, regardless of the number in competition for a premium. The judges may award no premium, second, or first premiums, as merit may warrant stating the reason in writing when requested.

## ENTRY PROCEDURES

1. **ALL ENTRIES IN ALL OPEN CLASSES MUST BE REGISTERED** for the 2024 Cass County Fair. Use the entry blank provided Online and on the back page of the Cass County Fair Exhibitor Book. Send the completed entry blank to: Cass County Ag Asso, PO Box 428, Pine River, MN 56474.
2. The CCAA reserves the right to limit the number of entries if space is unavailable. The management will endeavor to arrange for space for all exhibitors. However, if present accommodations are exhausted the management reserves the right to close entries at anytime.

## OPEN CLASS NON LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS:

1. All non-livestock exhibits, except flowers, may be entered Monday June 24, 4-7pm, Tuesday June 25, 2-7 p.m., Wednesday June 26, 7am-9am. Flowers will be accepted only Wednesday June 26, 7-9am. Exhibitors may enter one entry per lot.
2. **\$1 per lot Entry Fee. Entry fee also includes membership to Cass County Ag Asso.**
3. **NO EXHIBIT MAY BE REMOVED PRIOR TO NOON, SUNDAY, JUNE 30 OR ALL PREMIUMS AND AWARDS WILL BE FORFEITED.**
4. Articles must be entered in the name of the bona fide owner.
5. No person shall enter an article that has heretofore been exhibited and a premium paid thereon in the same lot except in certain designated classes.
6. ALL ARTICLES EXHIBITED MUST BE THE PROPERTY OF THE EXHIBITOR AND EXCEPT IN DESIGNATED CLASSES MUST BE MADE, MANUFACTURED, OR RAISED DURING THE PAST 12 MONTHS BY THE EXHIBITOR.
7. In no event will the Fair Management or the Department be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits

## OPEN CLASS LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS:

1. **Livestock exhibits must be stalled by 9am Wednesday, June 26. Registration available online/email until June 20.**
2. **\$2 per lot entry fee. Entry fee also includes membership to Cass County Ag Asso.**
3. No animal shall compete for more than one premium, except livestock which may be included in Get of Sire, Produce of Dam or Herd.
4. All livestock classes in open class are open to registered and grade animals and must remain on in the barns until livestock is released on Sunday. Animals exhibited in 4H cannot be entered in Open Class.
5. In all cases which call for registered stock, all animals must be accompanied by a certificate of registry, presented upon request.
6. **Exhibitors must obey the Minnesota Board of Animal Health Livestock Health Requirements for Public Exhibition rules and regulations.**

**All Sheep & Goats MUST be tagged/ID'ed with official USDA Scrapie/Flock tags.**

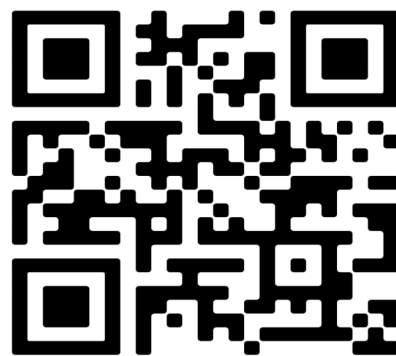

## Baja Rally Race Event Rules (Rules also available at [www.hardwatericeracing.com](http://www.hardwatericeracing.com))

- Strong Roll cage- 4 point, must be welded or bolted and be fastened securely (cars and pickups), must be made from at least a 1 1/4 inch diameter and .095" thickness. Cage must be inside the car within two inches of the roof, and truck cages must exceed 4 inches above the roof line. This is the bare minimum, more is recommended, especially in protecting truck cab. This is for your protection due to the high amount of rollovers.
- Remove all glass including headlights and taillights. Windshield is optional.
- All roof openings must have glass removed and be tinned or plated over. No cutting or chopping of the roof.
- Helmet and seat belts must be worn on the track at all times.
- Battery tied down and covered
- Gas tank and fuel systems left in original position, or safely relocated
- Similar to stock bumpers only, no sharp edges or over built bumpers.
- Driver's door is recommended to be welded, bolted or chained shut. If your door comes open during an event you will be black flagged. Door bars are allowed. Easily removable window net is recommended.
- Four wheel drive trucks-front shaft must be removed. Four wheel drive cars-rear shaft must be removed.
- Air bags removed
- Tow points on front and back of car
- All cars must pass a safety inspection. Vehicles will be disqualified for potential safety issues.
- Number clear and readable on sides and a vertical number must be attached securely to the roof. Roof numbers must be in white with a black background, and be at least 10" tall. If we can't read them from a distance, you may not be scored.
- Stock suspension
- All season tires. No snow, large lug, or mud tires. No alteration to the tire
- Radiator must stay in stock location. Front radiator and oil pan shielding allowed.
- Mud flaps are recommended for Truck
- All loose items, garbage, etc must be removed from inside the car prior to arrival at the track.
- No hitting in the drivers door!!!
- During the races, all pedestrians must stay off the track! No passengers!
- Any contestant found to be committing rule infractions will be disqualified and may forfeit being a contestant at any Cass County Fair event.
- Any un-sportsman like conduct by driver or pit crew will result in immediate removal from event with no refunds.
