### NON-LIVESTOCK

1. Entries can be mailed, registered online prior to 7pm, June 21<sup>st</sup> OR at the fair office during the open times prior to the fair .

Fair office is open for entries the week of the fair on:  
Sun 4-7pm | Mon 4-7pm | Tue 12-7pm | Wed 7-9am  
\*Flowers & Perishables: Wed 7-9am

2. Entry fees are \$2 per lot. One entry per lot, per person.  
*\*Non-livestock entries received prior to Sunday 7pm, will receive a \$1 discount per entry.\*\**

3. Entries Released 8am Sunday. Entries removed prior release time, will forfeit all premiums. Premiums will be available at release time.

4. Must be exhibitor-owned and recent (12 months).

### LIVESTOCK

1. Due to stalling, All livestock must be pre-entered by 7pm Sunday June 21, 2026. Entry fees are \$5 per lot. One entry per Lot, per person.

2. Animals must be checked in at the barns with the vet upon entry to fair on Tuesday 6-9pm or Wednesday 6-9am.

3. Poultry needs to be banded and pullorum tested prior to the fair or show proof of origination from a pullorum-typhoid clean hatchery or breeding flock. 4H is having a test agent test birds afternoon of May 17. Contact Cass Co. 4H Office for more info..

4. 4-H animals are not allowed to be entered in open class.

5. All Entries must obey MN Board of Animal Health rules and requirements for exhibition.

6. Sheep/goats require USDA Scrapie/Flock ID tags.

7. Animals must remain in stall until released 8am Sunday.

## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Cass Count Ag Association (CCAA) will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury.
2. Exhibits, Vendor Space and Livestock must remain clean, open and in place for viewing by the public during open hours until specified release times.
3. Advertising limited to assigned space.
4. CCAA Board resolves errors and disputes.
5. Violations may result in loss of premiums/future entry.
6. Exhibits must be owned by exhibitor.
7. Collections must be labeled; no duplicates. One entry per lot, per person.
8. Judges award based on merit, regardless of number or lots entered.
9. Livestock and Non-Livestock entries are released at 8:00 AM Sunday. Entries removed from Fairgrounds before release time, will forfeit all awards. Premiums available in office at release time.
10. Any photos taken by CCAA on the grounds, of exhibits or entries during the fair may be used in future advertising at the discretion of CCAA..

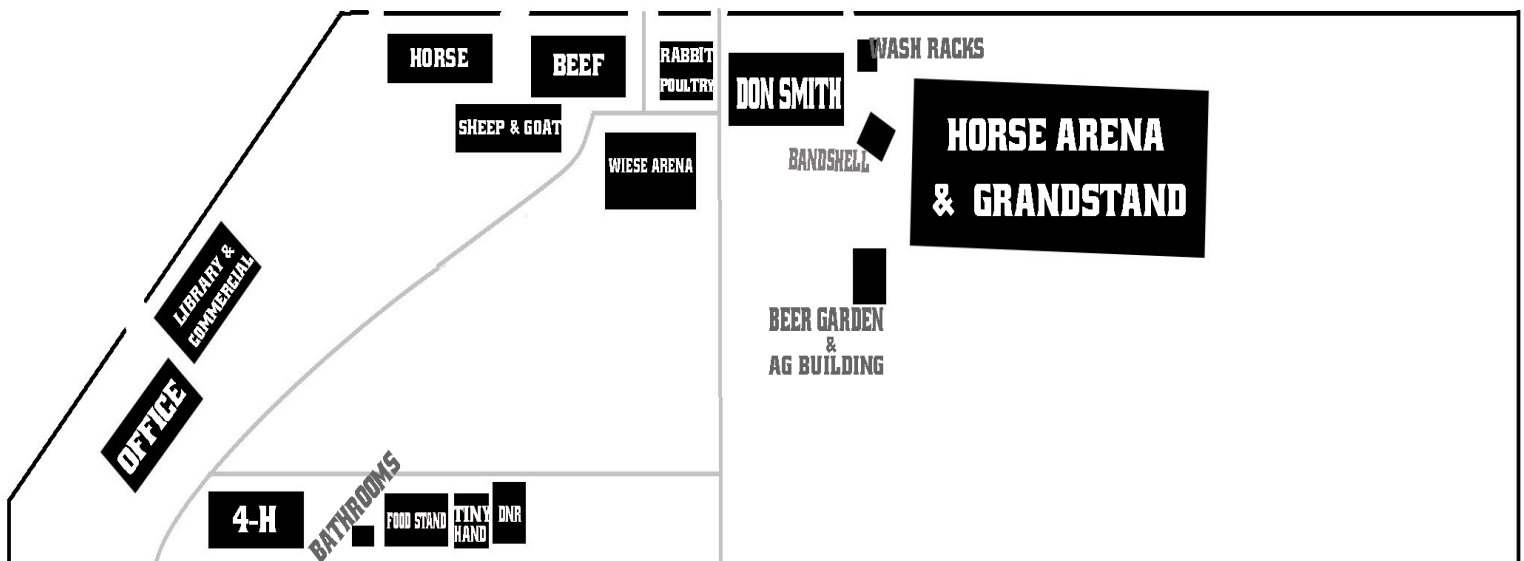

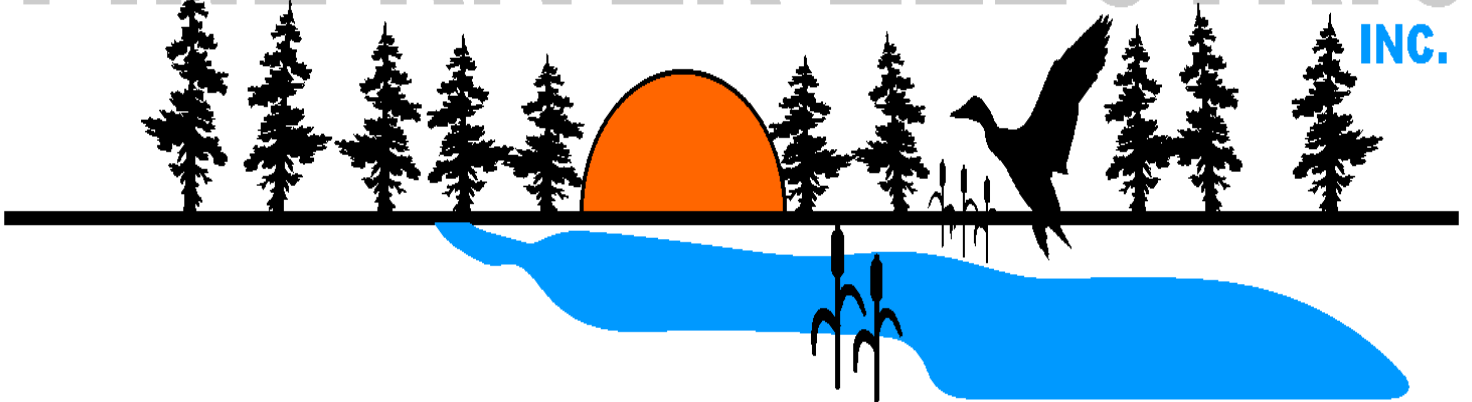

## Baja Rally Race Event Rules (Rules also available at [www.hardwatericeracing.com](http://www.hardwatericeracing.com))

- Strong Roll cage- 4 point, must be welded or bolted and be fastened securely (cars and pickups), must be made from at least a 1 1/4 inch diameter and .095' thickness. Cage must be inside the car within two inches of the roof, and truck cages must exceed 4 inches above the roof line. This is the bare minimum, more is recommended, especially in protecting truck cab. This is for your protection due to the high amount of rollovers.
- Remove all glass including headlights and taillights. Windshield is optional.
- All roof openings must have glass removed and be tinned or plated over. No cutting or chopping of the roof.
- Helmet and seat belts must be worn on the track at all times.
- Battery tied down and covered
- Gas tank and fuel systems left in original position, or safely relocated
- Similar to stock bumpers only, no sharp edges or over built bumpers.
- Driver's door is recommended to be welded, bolted or chained shut. If your door comes open during an event you will be black flagged. Door bars are allowed. Easily removable window net is recommended.
- Four wheel drive trucks-front shaft must be removed. Four wheel drive cars-rear shaft must be removed.
- Air bags removed
- Tow points on front and back of car
- All cars must pass a safety inspection. Vehicles will be disqualified for potential safety issues.
- Number clear and readable on sides and a vertical number must be attached securely to the roof. Roof numbers must be in white with a black background, and be at least 10" tall. If we can't read them from a distance, you may not be scored.
- Stock suspension
- All season tires. No snow, large lug, or mud tires. No alteration to the tire
- Radiator must stay in stock location. Front radiator and oil pan shielding allowed.
- Mud flaps are recommended for Truck
- All loose items, garbage, etc must be removed from inside the car prior to arrival at the track.
- No hitting in the drivers door!!!
- During the races, all pedestrians must stay off the track! No passengers!
- Any contestant found to be committing rule infractions will be disqualified and may forfeit being a contestant at any Cass County Fair event.
- Any un-sportsman like conduct by driver or pit crew will result in immediate removal from event with no refunds.

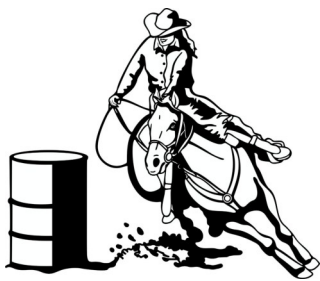
